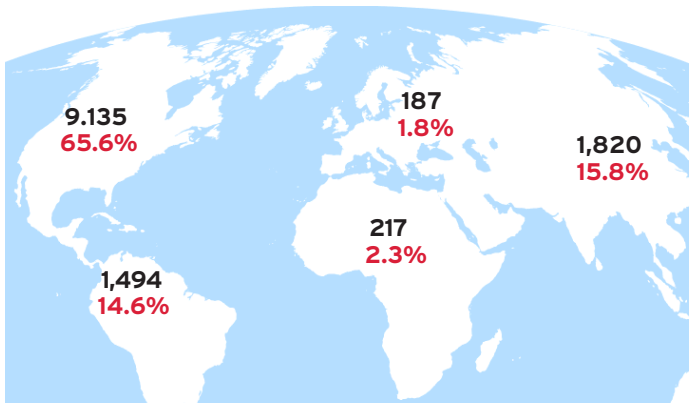


- Established in 1971, LaGuardia has the **largest English as a Second Language (ESL) program in New York City.**
- LaGuardia **ranked #5 among U.S. two-year colleges in economic mobility** - moving low-income people to the middle class and beyond - in a Stanford University study.
- LaGuardia students are **more likely to transfer to a 4-year college** than community college students nationally.
- Over the past decade, the LaGuardia Community College Foundation has raised more than **\$51 million for scholarships, emergency funds and new initiatives aimed at enhancing student success.**

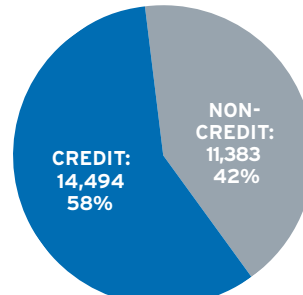

- Nearly **15,000 students** come from **130 countries**.*

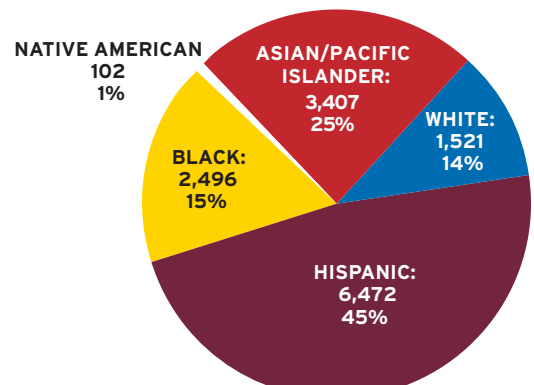

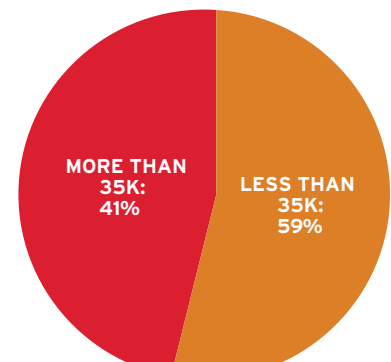


TOTAL ENROLLMENT

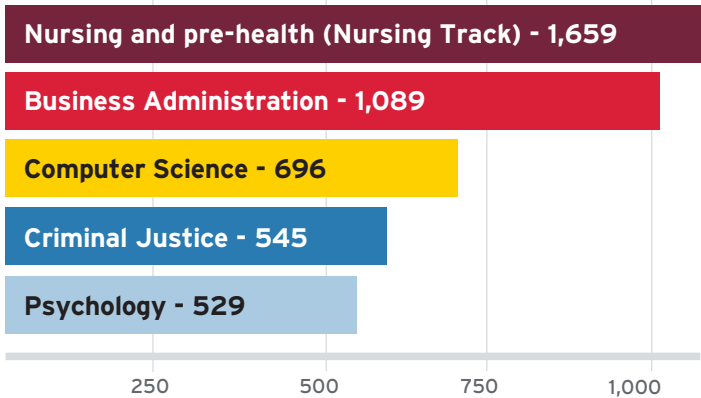


RACE/ETHNICITY

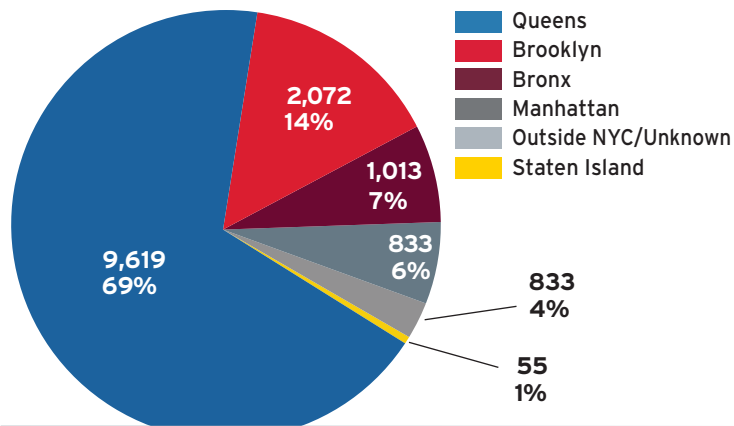


ANNUAL INCOME

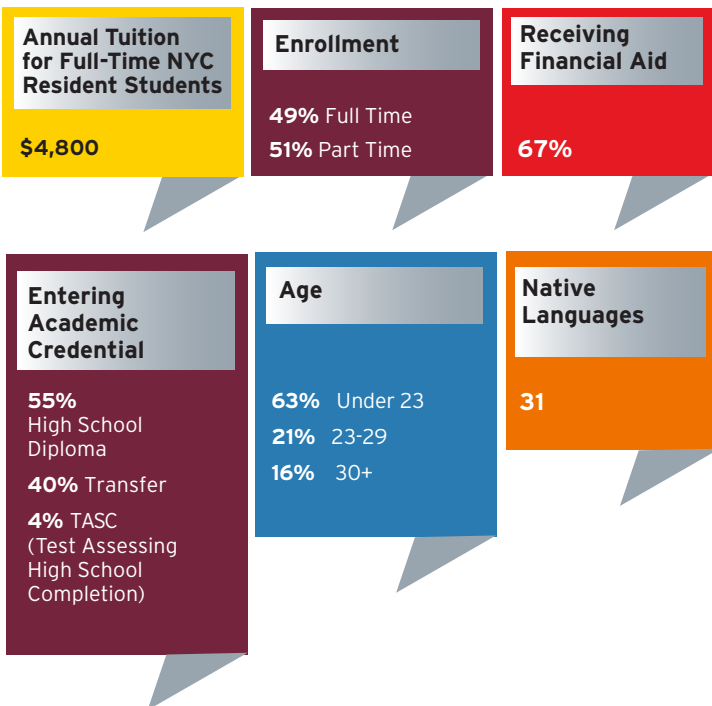
Charitable Support:
